The commentary asks, "Why has light been such a favorite symbol of God? Perhaps because light itself cannot be seen. We become aware of its presence when it enables us to see other things. Similarly, we cannot see God, but we become aware of God's presence when we see the beauty of the world, when we experience the love and goodness of our fellow human beings..."

A portion of the prayer on the back of the quilt, in Hebrew and English, appears in the 2007 Edition of the Mishkan T'filah Reform prayer book.

Instead, Aunt Addie was officially committed because “She talks too damn much.” She spent the rest of her days doing what soothed her soul: reading the Bible, writing letters, and penning poems.

I used crumpled parchment dipped in dye to give it texture. I created a thermofax using my name and hers, written on top of each other, that I screened down the middle of the piece. I used a needle-tipped bottle to write a poem I'd composed for her down either side of the quilt. The raw edges suggest our sometimes raw relationship, and the pleat in the middle the way we finally came together to make something new.

My nephew is 17 years old, driving and thinking about college. But when he was in first grade at Sandy Hook Elementary, one person with a semi-automatic rifle ended the possibility of a bright future for 20 of his classmates and six of the adults trying to keep them safe. Those six- and seven-year-olds should be 17 and 18 today. Instead of driving and thinking about the future, they are forever frozen in the past, having never made it past the days of playing with toy cars.

In this piece, the 20 broken toy cars represent the 20 children killed that day and the six red lines represent the adults who died trying to protect them. There are 1,000 stitches that make up those lines, one for each shooting on school grounds in the ten years after.

The young Jewish Schonfeld brothers pose hand in hand. The Star of David sewn to their clothing bears a sense of foreboding. In their rural Hungarian town, antisemitic laws forbid them to attend a school or sit on a park bench. Their father's business was closed and he was forced into slave labor. These boys witnessed unimaginable cruelties. Fear became part of their lives. In the summer of 1944, these brothers along with their mother, grandparents, aunts, uncles and cousins were transported in boxcars to Auschwitz. They were all murdered there. In the words of Imre Kertész, Nobel Laureate and Auschwitz survivor: "It should never happen to another child."

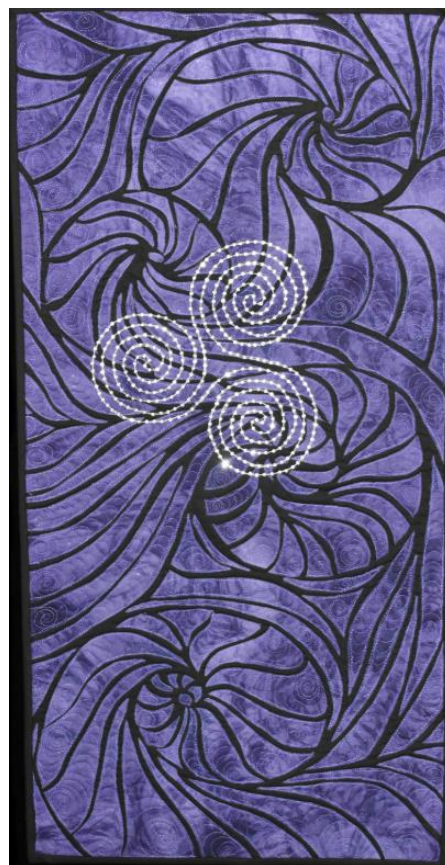
